4. FIRST AID MEASURES

General	Have the product container, label or Safety Data Sheet with you when calling a poison control center or physician, or going for treatment.
Advice:	center or physician, or going for treatment.
If on Skin:	Take off contaminated clothing. Wash skin with plenty of soap and water. If redness, burning, or irritation persists, call a POISON CENTER or doctor and get medical advice/attention. Wash contaminated clothing before reuse.
If in Eyes:	Hold eye open and rinse slowly and gently with water for 15 – 20 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present, after the first 5 minutes, then continue rinsing eye. Call a POISON CENTER or doctor for medical advice/attention.
If Swallowed:	Call a POISON CENTER or doctor for treatment advice. Have person sip a glass of water if able to swallow. Do not induce vomiting unless told to do so by a poison control center or doctor. Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.
If Inhaled:	Move person to fresh air. If person is not breathing, call 911 or an ambulance, and then give artificial respiration, preferably mouth-to-mouth, if possible. Call a POISON CENTER or doctor for medical advice/attention.

5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

Extinguishing Media:	Not flammable and can be quickly diluted with clean water. Use any means suitable for extinguishing surrounding fire. Oxidizing Agent may cause spontaneous ignition with oxidizing agent. Water spray may be used to keep fire exposed containers cool.
Combustion Products:	Carbon Oxides
Special Exposure Hazards:	Product (concentrate) can decompose and will release oxygen thereby adding to the fire hazard.

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Personal Precautions:	Ensure adequate ventilation. Remove all sources of ignition. Keep people away from and upwind of spill/leak. Avoid inhalation, ingestion and contact with skin and eyes. Wear impermeable clothing, safety goggles or face shield, and chemical resistant gloves.
Environmental Precautions:	In case of spill isolate area and deny entry to unnecessary personnel. Do not allow product to enter sewers, lakes, streams or other bodies of water.
Containment / Clean-Up Methods:	Stop spill at the source. Construct temporary dikes of dirt, sand, or other appropriate material to prevent spreading of the material. Absorb with an inert material such as sand or vermiculite and place in an appropriate container for disposal. Unused product (concentrate) is classified as a (D002) by RCRA criteria. Consult state and local authorities for restrictions on disposal of chemical wastes.



7. HANDLING & STORAGE

Handling: Avoid contact with skin and eyes. Good standards of hygiene should be maintained at all times. Smoking, eating, and drinking are prohibited in the work area. For personal protection wear impermeable clothing, safety goggles or face shield and chemical resistant gloves. Wash thoroughly after handling. Avoid breathing fumes, mist or vapours. Use only outdoors in a well-ventilated area.

Storage: Store in a cool, dry area at temperatures not exceeding 55°C (131°F). Keep away from heat, sparks or open flames, hot surfaces and direct sunlight. No smoking. Store in vented corrosive resistant container with a resistant inner liner. Never use metal containers or spigots. Keep container tightly closed when not in use. Keep out of reach of children and livestock. Store in locked location away from combustible materials and reactive substances.

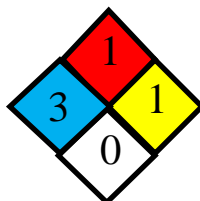
