4. FIRST AID MEASURES

General

Advice:

If on Skin:

Wash skin with plenty of soap and water/shower. If skin irritation or rash occurs: Get medical advice/attention. Take off contaminated clothing. Wash contaminated clothing before reuse.

If in Eyes:

Hold eye open and rinse cautiously with water for 15 – 20 minutes. Remove contact lenses, after the first 5 minutes if present and easy to do, then continue rinsing eye. If eye irritation persists: Get medical advice/attention.

If Swallowed:

Rinse mouth, DO NOT induce vomiting. If vomiting occurs naturally, have victim lean forward to reduce risk of aspiration. Never give anything by mouth if victim is unconscious or is convulsing. Obtain medical attention.

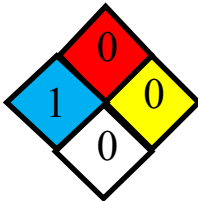
